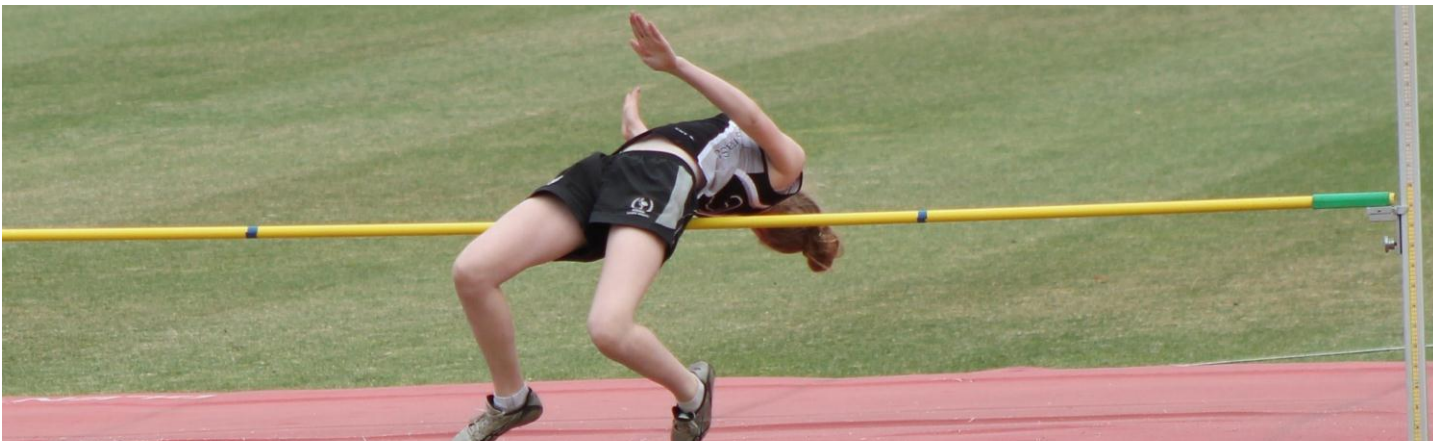
Kindergarten transition will continue for three more weeks.

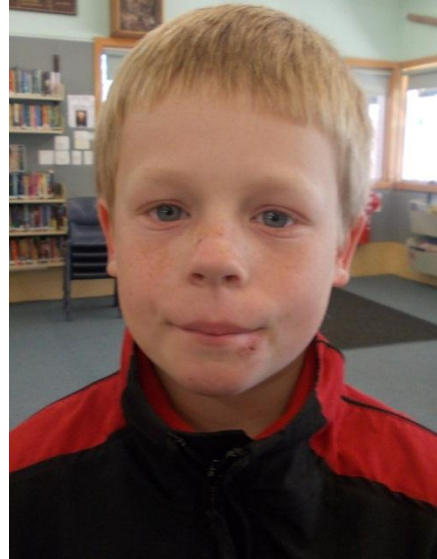
