The Rural and Aboriginal Medical Advocacy Program is a program designed for indigenous students and those that live far from the city. On the 8th of July, in the holidays, I attended this program at Notre Dame University of Australia in Sydney.

During this day I participated in lectures, a tour of the university's medicine school and got to work practically within the fields of suturing, CPR, plaster casting and using a defibrillator.

This course interested me as I want to be an epidemiologist when I leave school. This is the study and analysis of the patterns, causes, and effects of health and disease conditions in defined populations.
